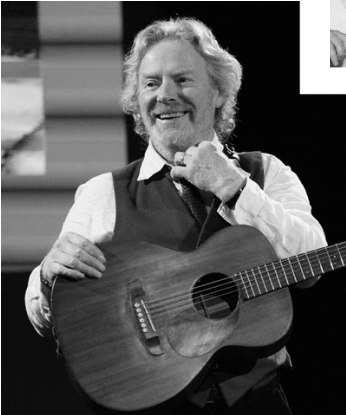
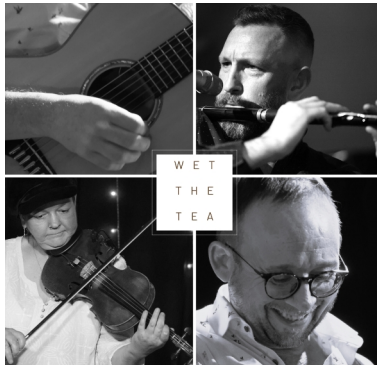

17 March - Jaywalkers



There's no better way to experience Jaywalkers than in person. Their live show's fun, intimate, and full of the kind of energy that can only come from a band completely immersed in the music they create. Their new album 'Move On' fuses fusing Bluegrass, Country, Folk & Americana with their signature virtuosity, humour & skill to create something that's both fresh and familiar.

28 April - Tacla

In the tradition of the Hot Club de Paris founded by Django Reinhardt & violinist Stéphane Grappelli. These guys however have a cheeky North Walean twist - always great fun, they'll keep you smiling all night!



The style is Gypsy swing mainly instrumental, some songs in both Welsh & English - dance music! Guitars, Violins are occasionally joined by double bass, clarinet, trumpet and snare drum, we don't always know which instruments, but we always know it'll be joyous!

16 June – Danny Bradley



Winner of the Liverpool Acoustic Judges' Award 2021, Danny is a finger-style guitarist and songwriter who has opened for Martin Carthy, Tony McManus, Jon Gomm, and Jeffrey Foucault. He is touring with Fairport Convention in 2025 as the opening act on their Winter Tour.

Danny's debut solo album, 'Small Talk Songs', is available now. Danny recorded the album himself, in his Liverpool city centre flat, with three microphones. Throughout the recording process, he opened the door to his little fifth-floor balcony, so that the songs of the Scouse seagulls overhead could be heard lilting quietly in the background of this airy, richly recorded acoustic album.

21 July - Bakerfield



Bakerfield offer an eclectic mix of songs and stories as they invite you to join them on their musical journey.

With their own versions of songs from Guy Clark, Steve Earle, Gillian Welch and many others interspersed with self-penned songs covering topics from the sublime to the ridiculous, you can expect to be laughing one minute, and crying the next.

Guitar, Double Bass, Mandolin, Harmonica, Ukelele and Banjo all make an appearance and support strong lead vocals and instinctive harmonies.

1 Sept – Reg Meuross

Reg's clever and imaginative lyrics have earned him the title of "Master Storyteller" (PennyBlack Music) and led Mike Harding (Mike Harding Folk Show) to introduce him onto the stage of The Royal Albert Hall as "one of the finest singer-songwriters this country has produced".

Whether it's a village hall or the Albert Hall, Reg brings to the stage a collection of extremely beautiful songs, performed with humour and depth, and sung with the voice of an angel.

Reg has that rare gift of being able to touch people, through his songs and performance, on a really human level. His words and music paint pictures that remain with the listener long after the song has been sung.

13 Oct – Wet The Tea



WetTheTea is a multi-instrument act fronted by singer-songwriter and musician Andy Connally. Along with Andy's traditional Irish influences, Clare and Adam bring many other musical influences that are all fused to create something a little bit different.

With roots, english folk, bluegrass and modern elements thrown into the mix, WetTheTea songs and tune sets are quite unique. Original, self-penned songs make up the majority of the band's material, and Andy takes you through the journey of each of the songs he's written and how they came to be. These words offer an insight into his life experiences, passions, and vulnerabilities with a feeling of familiarity and honesty.

24 Nov – Joe Topping

Described by Sir Tom Jones as "a Weaver of Dreams", Joe Topping is a folk singer and multi instrumentalist from Liverpool whose singing and guitar playing regularly moves listeners to tears.

His charismatic stage presence and engaging stories have entertained audiences all over the country and all across Europe, including live sessions on BBC Radio 2, ITV television, The National Film Awards and a showcase at SXSW in Texas.
